"Going Home" by the Rev. F. Allan Weatherholt, Jr.

"In my Father's house are many rooms . . . " -- Jesus to His Disciples at the Last Supper, St. John 14:2

It happens periodically when I make visits to our shut-ins in area Nursing Homes, and it is always so heart-wrenching. It happened to me again a month or so before Easter. Rev'd Anne and many of our Clergy friends and associates report having had this same heartwrenching experience.

It happens like this: a resident of the Nursing Home, seeing from my collar that I am a member of the Clergy, will say, "Father (or Pastor), please take me home. Take me home!" Very often these persons will grasp my hand or stretch out their arms and plead - plead tearfully for me to take them home. Sometimes the plea comes from our own parishioners. Sometimes it comes from a resident who does not even know me personally but, recognizing that I am one of the Clergy, makes this piercing plea. How very, very sad it is not to be able to do as they ask.

Home – we all long to be there. Those who must spend their final days in Nursing Facilities would give almost anything to be home again. No matter how wonderful a vacation trip might be, it's always great to come home. What is more comforting than to come home and unwind after a tiring, stressful workday? Christian faith, our prayer lives in our homes help to transform our houses into "havens of blessing and peace" (Prayer Book, page 431).

Our Lord Jesus knew all about home. His Blessed Mother Mary and His earthly Father Joseph provided him with a very loving and Godcentered home in His early years in Nazareth. Later, when He began His ministry, Jesus gave up the comfort, safety and peace of His own home for the sake of His great mission. He relied on the hospitality of friends and strangers who welcomed Him into their own homes as He traveled about, preaching, teaching and healing.

But Jesus never forgot that loving home of His childhood. Even more, He never forgot the loving Heavenly home from which He came before He was on this earth! So, just before He suffered His saving death for us on the Cross, He made us a promise. At the Last Supper, among His final words to His disciples (and us!) were these:

"In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And when I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also." [St. John 14:2-3]

These Great 50 Days of Easter – this joyful Eastertide – this is the Season when we especially celebrate that wonderful promise. The Risen Jesus – our Easter Lord – is preparing a place for each of us. It is a Heavenly home, lovingly made ready by the One who loves us the most. And when our earthly homes can no longer serve us, when our earthly bodies can no longer house us, we have a Heavenly home awaiting our arrival!

Each time we go home, each time we embrace our loved ones, each time we gather in fellowship around a table of food in our homes, we should remember. These wonderful moments are foretastes — previews -- of the even more wonderful moments that await us. They await us in that Heavenly home which Jesus is preparing for you, for me, for each of us who are His.

Alleluia! Christ is Risen! May this joyful Eastertide remind us of our Heavenly home!

Memorial Evensong and Organ Concert



On Sunday, May 1, at 4:00 pm, Ascension will hold a service of Evensong (sung Evening Prayer) in the Stone Church in memory of parishioners who have passed away during the past several years.

The service will be played and directed by David Kreider, who served as Organist and Choir Director of Ascension for over 30 years. Dr. Kreider will direct a choir of volunteers who will sing the beautiful canticles, responses, and hymns of this traditional Anglican Service.

The worship service will be followed by an organ concert played by Daniel Weatherholt, son of our Interim Rector and Organist and Director of Music at St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Poolesville.

Daniel Weatherholt is currently a candidate for the Master of Sacred Music Degree at the Westminster Choir College in Princeton, NJ. His program will include compositions by J.S. Bach, James Pethel, and Ralph Vaughan Williams. Please invite your friends and neighbors to hear Daniel's inspiring recital on the fine organ in our beautiful, historic Stone Church.

A reception in the Fellowship Hall will follow the Service and Recital.
