#### Gratitude

Dear Ascension Family:

As I was browsing through the United Thank Offering (UTO) website to find a blessing for our UTO ingathering service on May 5, I found an article about gratitude.

"Gratitude is a pretty simple concept but is something that many people find hard to practice. Being grateful requires simply noticing something good in your life and responding with thanks. Noticing more good things, feeling gratitude for them, and thanking the people who made those good things possible builds positivity and happiness in both the grateful person and the thanked people."

I agree, gratitude is simple, but too often we hear so much bad or disturbing news that we are overwhelmed with our own problems or those faced by our loved ones that it is not easy to be grateful and to give thanks to the Lord for all the good things that are happening in us and all around us. Being grateful requires simply noticing something good in your life and responding with thanks. The truth is that the more we train ourselves to notice good things and to give thanks for them, the more we will find reasons to practice gratitude.

That reminds me of the story told by the French Cardinal Marty. He was appointed Bishop of Paris in 1968, when the French capital was plagued by social disturbances and riots. Bishop Marty encountered a lot of people who were suffering from the situation, and this had

consequences on his spiritual life. He noticed that he spent his prayer time asking God to help people, but he had nothing to be thankful for. That bothered him. So, he decided that each day he would write down 10 things to give thanks for. He said that, at first, he had problems writing anything down in his notebook. He started to look around him more attentively and soon he was able to give thanks to the Lord for more than 10 persons or situations. He noticed a person smiling to a stranger in the metro, an act of kindness in the street, a person sharing something personal with him. His life was filled with gratitude.

What amazes me about the story of Cardinal Marty is that the situation around him had not changed, there was the same amount of violence and suffering, but he changed. His desire and willingness to look at the world with the eyes of Christ helped him to see the beauty of creation, the love of God in tiny details that he could not see before.

The more we are looking for and noticing good things around us, even a small smile or a flower in bloom, the more our heart will notice the good all around us. The more we will be filled with gratitude. The more our hearts will praise the Lord for the goodness present all around us.

I hope and pray that your heart will be filled with gratitude and that with the psalmist you will be able to say:

# What is Realm?

Realm is the new church software that will be used for the church's database and finances. In addition, Realm will eventually be used for communication, scheduling, and more. We will let you know as the various tools included in Realm are implemented.

Beginning on May 1, 2024, the church's accounting will be live on Realm, allowing the Treasurer and the Vestry to manage our finances more efficiently.

From now on, all checks must be payable to Church of the Ascension, and on the memo line please indicate the purpose: Pledge, Buildings and Grounds, Mistletoe Mart, Altar Guild, and so on. In Realm, donations will be clearly identified by their funds. For instance if you write a check payable to the Outreach Committee, it will be marked as restricted for Outreach.

**You will soon receive an invitation to create your Realm account** where you will be able to access your personal information, your donations, a church directory, and more as the various options are implemented. Realm will eventually be our main communication, scheduling and registration tool.

Realm will be implemented step by step. Information and training for this user-friendly system will be provided. Look for additional information and updates about Realm in the weeks and months to come!






The Mistletoe Mart Committee is busy planning for **Mistletoe Mart #50 which will take place in 7** months on November 7-9, 2024.

- 1. Opening:
  - a. The meeting began at 6:32 pm.

  - b. Praver: Fr. Pierre-Henry
    - Note: Kim Tompkins filled in as Registrar for this Vestry Meeting while Jackie Weschler is on maternity leave. She has a master copy of all documents for Jackie upon her return.
- Approval of Consent Agenda:
  - a. Vestry Meeting Minutes (February 27<sup>th</sup>, 2024), Vestry Resolutions (February), Vestry Notes (March 12, 2024), 2024 Lawn Care Contract Documentation, Ascension By-Laws (February 12, 2023).
    - i. Motion Approved: Rick Reinders motioned to accept. Beverly Baker seconded. All in favor.
    - Finance Committee Monthly Financial Reports (January March, 2024) dated 4/8/2024:
      - i. Vestry must review & accept the Financial Reports on a monthly basis.
        - 1. Motion Approved: Roberta Wilhelm motioned to accept. Beverly Baker seconded. All in favor.
- Old Business:
  - a. Employee Retention Credit (ERC) update:
    - i. The \$ 21,864.94 credit is expected to be received within the next couple months.
      - 1. Rick explained the credit will most likely be sent to Ascension in four partial payments throughout the year.
  - b. Audit for 2023 update:
    - i. Audit is in process between Jim Jordan, Debbie Bargar and Nancy Starner.
      - 1. Update is pending.
  - c. Offertory Counting Teams update:
    - . Donna Hansen and Beverly Baker are the current counting team until the 2023 Audit is complete and best practices are identified and implemented. Debbie Bargar is backup.
      - 1. Current process is going well.
      - 2. Process improvement is pending based upon audit and Realm system implementation.
      - Once continuous improvement processes are implemented, new counting teams will also be trained.
  - d. Middendorf Loan update:
    - i. Documentation requested for Vestry education and update (handout).
    - ii. Action: Father Pierre-Henry will obtain summary document and send to the vestry.

      - Action for May Meeting: Liaison assignment in process. Will continue to address at May vestry meeting to address the remaining gaps.
      - 2. Action for May Meeting: Fr. Pierre-Henry will clearly define the vestry liaison role. The major goal is to facilitate communication between the vestry and committee chair.
      - 3. Note: Liaisons identified at today's meeting can begin to contact their committees.
  - g. 1844 Shoppe update:
    - i. Conversations continue to take place regarding extending shop hours by day.
    - ii. Action: Donna Hansen will work with the 1844 Shoppe to enhance the communication to congregation, including requesting additional volunteers.
  - h. Boy Scout items stored in the 30 N. Court Street Shed and under the Fellowship Hall stairs update:
    - i. Action: Carrie Goff reported that Robin Goff will:
      - 1. Clear out the Fellowship Hall area during the week of April 15.
      - 2. Invite other BSA members to review what is in the shed during April & May.
      - Research the older Pinewood Derby racetrack options with other BSA members during April & May.
  - i. Purchase and Install a Camera for the Nursery update:
    - i. Action: Jackie Weschler is researching options.
- 4. New Business:
  - a. Expenditure Approval Process Current Guidelines:
  - It is understood best practices are being researched and policies may be updated in the future.
    - i. Action: Vestry Liaisons can begin to communicate this current process to committee chairs.
  - b. Finance Committee Current Role:
    - The Vestry has the ultimate responsibility for the finances of Ascension. The Finance Committee is to assist
      with generating and maintaining the church funds and aid with financial decision making. It is an advisory
      role and provides factual data to the Vestry.

  - 3. Oversee the financial reporting to vestry, rector, church groups and congregation.

  - Motion Approved: Buildings & Grounds and Vestry agree to the prioritization sequence for upcoming projects:

      - b. Gutter and downspout repairs (estimate \$ 6,000).
      - c. Brick work repairs and repointing (estimate \$ 2,500).
    - 2. Defer signage to a future timeframe. Perhaps the diocese has options.
      - a. Signage (estimate \$ 6,000).
        - Action: Fr. Pierre-Henry will contact the diocese to research if any funding options exist.
- d. Contract Review Committee Status (Beth Anthony, Diana Baker, Kim Tompkins):
  - i. Provide status update to review existing service contracts in order to develop a spreadsheet outlining current contract renewal dates.
  - ii. As a result, the impacted committee can review the business situation, new quotes can be requested and a new contract can be reviewed and submitted for approval before the existing contract either expires or is automatically renewed.
  - iii. Action: Beth Anthony has begun to review open contracts and is beginning to review timeframes. Working with Office and B&G to obtain any missing contracts. Will also explore subscriptions. Beth will request support and assistance as needed.
- e. 2024 Budget Review Status (Fr. Pierre-Henry):
  - i. Status update for the 2024 annual budget was provided at the meeting (handout).
  - ii. Fr. Pierre-Henry played a video from an Episcopal church in Texas regarding various reasons for church budget deficits and options they explored to address.

  - i. Schedule was provided at meeting for Vestry informational purposes (handout).
- g. Buildings & Grounds Fire Alarm and Sprinkler System:
  - i. Roberta Wilhelm handed out a Fire Alarm and Sprinkler System document.
