### **“The Easter Gift”**

Easter Day, we at Ascension pray, was a joyful day for you and your loved ones. Children, of course, received Easter gifts – baskets and perhaps a special toy or two. Adults also may have received Easter gifts – flowers, candy, an item of new clothing, etc.

As the Great Fifty Days of Easter stretch on, it is fitting for all of us to remember what the real gift of Easter is. The heart and soul of our Christian faith is the glorious message of Easter itself: **“Christ is Risen!”** And with Him, we will be risen too! As one of our great Easter Hymns says:

***Death is conquered, we are free,  
Christ has won the victory!***

Each year on March 2 and September 30, my family and I quietly but prayerfully remember the anniversaries of my parents' death. My family was a close one, and Mom and Dad, both strong Episcopalians, were wonderful parents – and later grandparents to our sons, Daniel and Stephen, and to my brother's three children. We treasure the time we had together, particularly at holidays and birthdays. I know my parents' faith in our Lord had a deep impact upon their five grandchildren.

My Dad died on September 30, 1995. He had been suffering from dementia, had developed numerous physical problems as well, and his passing was not unexpected. My Mother died suddenly on the morning of

March 2, 1999, of a massive heart attack. Her passing, being sudden, was more jarring for our family. There had been no time for good-byes.

But amazingly, I found that, in a way, my Mother had “left me a message” when she passed. Each day, Mom always read from a special devotional book which she loved. I was using that same book at the time she died. It was always an extra “connection” between Mom and me, because I knew she was reading the same message I was each day as we both prayed.

Well, in the entry for March 2, the morning of my 84-year-old Mom’s death, I found that the writer of the message in that devotional book was speaking of **an 84-year-old woman** who had sent him a note of comfort after he had lost someone. This 84-year-old wrote that she hoped her message would bring her younger friend comfort and strength in his loss. She included a quotation from a tombstone in an old North Carolina cemetery. The words were:

***Spring will come again to the valley.  
Flowers will grow on the mountains.  
And the Shepherd will return for His sheep.***

I was absolutely amazed to find those words of comfort on that March morning of my Mom’s passing twenty-four years ago. I really felt that God intended them for me that day. But then ours is a God who never leaves us comfortless. Those words of comfort were my Easter gift that year – given a little early, since it was still Lent.

When Mary Magdalene went to Jesus’ tomb in the dark that Sunday morning, she found her Easter Gift. In discovering the Resurrection, Mary Magdalene received the greatest gift ever! Anyone who has lost a loved one knows that this is the best Easter gift of all – the gift of eternal life.

**Enjoy your Easter Gift!** It’s the best! Alleluia! Amen!

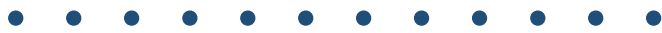

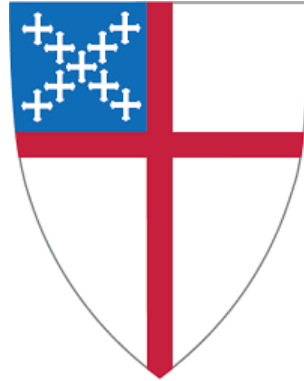
### Our Prayers are with Fr. Allan

Planting the tree in the photo are Gary Lang, Deb Vana, and Steve Vana.

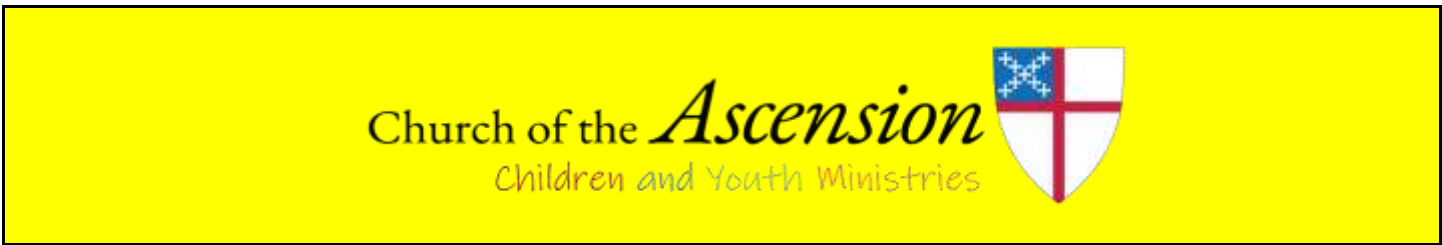
