Rector's Message

The Higher Calling of Christian Life

Dear Siblings in Christ:

As we move into the heart of fall, the season of harvest reminds us of God's abundance and our role as caretakers of all we have been given. At Ascension, fall is also the stewardship season, but really what we are talking about is Christian living. Stewardship is simply one expression of the greater call to follow Jesus—a way of life that deepens our relationship with God and each other.

Stewardship means recognizing that everything we have—our time, our talents, our resources, and even our very lives—are gifts from God. It is our joyful response to these gifts, using them to honor God and build up God's kingdom. While you will soon receive a letter about our 2025–2026 stewardship campaign, please remember this is not simply a fundraising effort. It is an opportunity to reflect on how we are living out our baptismal vows and participating in the mission of Ascension.

We also pause to give thanks. So much of the ministry at Ascension is possible because of your generosity—not only financial giving, but also the countless hours given to worship, outreach, music, fellowship, children and youth, altar guild, buildings and grounds, Bible studies, fundraising, and quiet behind-the-scenes support. Rector's Message continued...

In a world that often feels fractured and filled with hatred, violence, and division, our call to stewardship has never been more vital. We live in a stressful political climate, with daily reports of shootings and polarization.

As Christians, we are called to a higher standard than the world around us, one that rises above the noise of political parties and societal strife.

Our example is the Lord Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, who commands us to love God and to love our neighbor—all of our neighbors, regardless of their color, sexual orientation, origin, or political beliefs. That does not mean that we agree on everything, but we acknowledge that our differences are what make the human family so special. This is the Baptismal Covenant we each renew in Christ: to follow his example, to be held accountable, and to uphold these promises: to continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of the bread, and in the prayers; to persevere in resisting evil and to repent when we fall into sin; to proclaim the Good News of God in Christ by word and example; and to seek and serve Christ in all persons.

This call to love is not easy. Jesus commands us to love even our enemies and to bless those who curse us. It challenges us to be bold Christians who embody Christ's way of life, no matter what is happening in the world. For us as Episcopalians, this means taking seriously the final promise of our baptismal vows: to strive for justice and peace among all people and to respect the dignity of every human being.

In a world so polarized, we are called to be centered on Christ and to be guided and strengthened by the Lord. This is why our Sunday communion, the breaking of the bread, is so central to our lives. It is the source of the grace we need to follow Jesus's way—to refuse to add violence to violence, and to see in every person, especially those who are very different from us, a beloved child of God for whom Christ died.

This is what we will explore together in the coming weeks. On Sunday, October 26, The Rev. Canon Dr. Kristofer Lindh-Payne, Canon to the Ordinary for Leadership for the Diocese of Maryland,

will preach on this higher calling and

lead a parish discussion after the service. It will be a time to reflect on what we are doing as a community and where God is calling us to go next. I invite you to pray about this, to reflect on your own spiritual journey, and to join us in this important conversation.

Stewardship Campaign

Tell Out My Soul!

Our 2025 Stewardship Campaign: Tell Out My Soul will begin on Sunday, October 5, and conclude on Sunday, November 9, when we will gather and bless our pledge cards in a special act of worship. Each week during this season, reflections will be shared to help us explore the deep connection between gratitude and generosity.

The theme, Tell Out, My Soul, comes from Mary's song of praise, The Magnificat (Luke 1:46–55). Upon learning she would bear the Son of God, Mary responds not with fear or doubt, but with a joyful eruption of praise, proclaiming the greatness of the Lord. Her song reminds us that stewardship begins not with numbers on a page, but with a grateful heart. Our giving is our own song of praise—the way we "tell out" the goodness of God in our lives.

Just as Mary offered her life, we are invited to offer our gifts back to God during the Eucharist. When we bring bread, wine, and our financial offerings to the altar, we are offering ourselves—our labor, our time, our talents, our very souls—trusting that God will bless and multiply them for the sake of the Kingdom.

The simple truth is that the Church of the Ascension cannot exist without the generosity of its people. Every hour of time, every talent

shared, every dollar given makes possible our worship, our ministries, and our care for one another. Your pledge fuels our mission, sustains our sacred spaces, and keeps our community a beacon of God's love in Westminster.

During this Stewardship season, I invite you to reflect on the blessings you have received through Ascension, and to give thanks for the generations of faithful stewards who, since 1844, have built and sustained this parish. Now it is our turn to add our voices to that chorus of generosity.

Our goal this year is 100% participation. We hope that every member of our parish family will return a pledge card. No gift is too small, and no gift is too large. What matters is your participation. Every pledge is a statement of faith, belonging, and gratitude.


Let us join our voices and our gifts together. May our collective generosity be a joyful song that supports the mission and

Highlights from the September 30, 2025 Vestry Meeting

Present: The Rev. Pierre-Henry Buisson, Kim Tompkins (Sr. Warden), Gary Lang (Jr. Warden), Beverly Baker, Mark Howe, Liz Lowe, Deborah Rio, Roberta Wilhelm, Debbie Bargar (Finance). Excused: David Anderson, Diana Baker, Melissa Leahy.

After the opening prayer led by Fr. Pierre-Henry, the Vestry approved the Consent Agenda, including the July 29, 2025 Special Financial Meeting Minutes, September 2, 2025 Vestry Meeting Minutes, Financial Letter from the Vestry, Senior Warden's Report, Vestry Liaison Reports for the Altar Guild, Memorials, Mistletoe Mart and Welcome ministries.

Deborah Rio remains on the Vestry but resigned as the Registrar. Therefore, the Vestry will need to identify candidates to fill this open position.

Debbie Bargar, Chair of the Finance Committee, reviewed the Financial Reports for August, 2025. Actual Income was \$28,566.23, Actual Expenses were \$48,122.31, resulting in a net loss of \$19,556.08. Please note: The \$11,898.65 Maintenance Expense included \$9,416 for the paving of the parking lot which was funded by the Middendorf Loan.

The Realm Booking Services had been budgeted through June 2025. The Vestry voted to extend these services through 2025. The columbarium will be added to our existing property insurance policy with Brotherhood. Building a 7-foot metal fence with Rustic Fence for the alcove by the Fellowship Hall outside door was approved.

A clean-up task list for the Fellowship Hall will be posted to ensure that when the space is used by either Ascension ministries or outside organizations, it will be consistently cleaned afterwards.

The Stewardship Campaign, "Tell Out My Soul," will run from October 5, 2025 through November 9, 2025. Letters will be mailed to the congregation and speakers will be identified. Communication will also be included in the weekly Enews, monthly Extension and on the church website.

As follow up to the Adult Forum held with Canon Kristofer Lindh-Payne on Sunday, August 24, a second forum with be held with Canon Kristofer on Sunday, October 26, after both the 8:00 am and the 10:15 am services. This will also allow the parish to continue to discuss concerns and ideas about limited resources to support current ministry responsibilities as we explore solutions in this challenging area.


Nursery Care: Sunday Morning (9:00–10:00 am)


Ghanaian Mother's Hope

Dear Ascension Friends:

On September 20, It was so wonderful to celebrate 20 years of ministry in Ghana at Ascension, my home church. I loved seeing so many people showing up in their African attire. Thank you so much for being my prayer partner and support for the last 20 years.

In 2007, Ghanaian Mothers' Hope opened our first nursery in a small village in Ghana. One little boy named Eric was so cute wearing his red sweater with a hood. It was handmade by a generous donor, and Eric loved it. It was 78 degrees, and looking at Eric made me break out in a sweat.


Later that year, Eric suffered 4th degree burns on the left side of his body when a gasoline generator powering his family's well exploded. It took 7 hours before Eric could get treatment. But Eric was a survivor. He recovered, went back to school, and recently graduated from high school.
