Rector's Message

Dear Friends in Christ:

When we greet one another, we often ask, "How are you?" It's usually a habit, and we expect the answer to be "Fine." People are sometimes surprised when we say we are not fine—and even more surprised when we pause long enough to really listen.

So let me ask it again, slowly: **How are you doing?**

So much is happening right now—in our own lives, in our parish, in our community, and in the wider world. Many of us are grieving the death of Jenny Beeker. Many are carrying concern for loved ones facing illness, financial strain, loneliness, or uncertainty. Some of us feel tired, overwhelmed, or anxious without quite knowing why.

We live in a time when harsh words, fear, and division often seem louder than compassion or understanding. The constant stream of news can leave us feeling unsettled, discouraged, or even unsafe. It is not easy to remain grounded when the world feels fragile.

As Christians, we do not pretend that fear or pain are not real. But we follow Jesus, who meets us in our fear and calls us into love—love of neighbor, love of stranger, love that does not deny reality but refuses to let fear have the final word.

Rector's Message continued...

I want to say this honestly: there are moments when I, too, feel afraid. And that is why the life we share in Christ—in prayer, worship, service, and community—matters so deeply. Here, we are not alone. Here, we listen to one another. Here, we practice love, even when the world around us feels unsteady.

That is why it matters so much to gather together Sunday after Sunday, to worship the Lord as a community. Jesus promises us that when two or three are gathered in his name, he is there among us. Knowing that the Lord is present when we come together is a deep comfort to me.

We come as we are—with our pains and sufferings, our doubts and our hopes. We bring our lives, and the lives of those we love, before the Lord of all. In his presence, we are reminded that we are known, forgiven, and loved.

Christ is present among us in many ways: in the community gathered in his name, in the Word proclaimed through the readings and the sermon, and in the sacramental bread and wine—his Body and Blood given for us. And when we leave worship, we are sent back into the world renewed, pardoned, strengthened, and sustained by God's grace, to live with hope, courage, and love.

Sometimes I hear people say, "I'm glad I'm an Episcopalian, because I don't have to go to church every Sunday." And in one sense, that is true: we are not bound by obligation or fear. No one is forced.

But the deeper truth is this: **we are invited.**

We gather not because we have to, but because we want to—out of love for the Lord who calls us, Sunday after Sunday, to come together as his people. Worship is not a requirement to be checked off, but a relationship to be nurtured.

The very word church helps us understand this. The Latin ecclesia comes from the Greek ekklēsia, reflecting a biblical understanding of God's people as those who are called together. Church is not first a building or an institution; it is a people who have been called—by God—to gather, to listen, to pray, and to be sent.

Each Sunday, Christ calls us again. Not with coercion, but with love. And when we respond to that call, we discover once more who we are—and whose we are.

In three weeks, we will enter the season of Lent with the celebration of Ash Wednesday on February 18. Lent is a time to deepen our relationship with the Lord and with one another. *(Continued on p. 3)*

Together, we will follow Christ from the desert to his passion, death, and resurrection on Easter morning, April 5. I hope this Lent will offer each of us an opportunity to pray more intentionally, serve more faithfully, and love one another more fully.

This shared life of worship and love also shapes how we make decisions together as a parish, including at our Annual Meeting on February 8, when we will gather to give thanks for the past year, elect new members of the Vestry, and honor all who offer their gifts in service to this parish.

May Christ meet you in your fear and your hope.

May you know yourself held in God's love.

And may the Holy Spirit guide us, as we listen, discern, and walk together in faith.

Ash Wednesday – February 18

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent—a forty-day journey of prayer, repentance, and renewal that prepares us for the joy of Easter. It is one of the most solemn and meaningful days of the Christian year, inviting us to pause, to reflect, and to turn our hearts again toward God.

On Ash Wednesday, we hear words that are both humbling and honest: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." These words are not meant to frighten us, but to tell the truth about our humanity. We are finite. We are fragile. And we are deeply loved by God. The ashes we receive on our foreheads—made from the palms of last year's Palm Sunday—are a visible sign of repentance, mortality, and hope. They remind us that even what seems spent or finished can be transformed by God's grace.

Lent is not about self-punishment or guilt. It is about creating space—space to pray more intentionally, to listen more deeply, to let go of what distracts us from God, and to practice acts of mercy and generosity. It is a season that invites us to be honest about our lives, trusting that God meets us not with judgment, but with compassion and forgiveness.

A Holy Beginning

As is our tradition, we will offer two Ash Wednesday services.

- **At 12:00 p.m.**, we will gather in the Stone Church for a spoken liturgy with the imposition of ashes.
- **At 7:00 p.m.**, we will join with our brothers and sisters of **Westminster United Methodist Church** for a **shared ecumenical service**, hosted at the UMC. I will have the privilege of preaching at the evening service, continuing a meaningful partnership between our congregations that reflects our shared faith in Christ.

Whether you come at midday or in the evening, whether you come with clarity or with questions, Ash Wednesday offers a quiet and grace-filled beginning. God meets us where we are and invites us, once again, to walk the way of love that leads through the cross and into resurrection life.

I hope you will join us as we begin this holy season together.

Walking Faithfully into 2026: A Pastoral Word on Our Parish Finances

Over the past several weeks, many of you have heard me speak about our Vestry's work on the 2026 parish budget. I am grateful for the thoughtful attention, prayers, and generosity that have accompanied this process, and I would like to offer a brief clarification as we move forward together.

At its meeting last Tuesday, January 27, the Vestry adopted a 2026 budget that reflects both our financial realities and our deep commitment to the mission and ministry of the Church of the Ascension. The budget currently includes a projected deficit of \$16,563.35. This budget also incorporates a \$40,000 diocesan grant and \$7,000 drawn from unrestricted reserve funds, both of which help stabilize our financial picture for the year ahead.

The Vestry's hope—and mine—is that this remaining gap can be bridged over the course of the year through additional pledges, increased giving, or special gifts, as well as through careful stewardship of our resources. The Vestry will be closely monitoring utility usage, exploring new ways our buildings might be used to generate revenue, and continuing to manage expenses prudently. As part of this work, the Vestry also made the difficult decision to eliminate one musician position, a choice made solely for financial reasons and not without regret.

One important decision the Vestry reached together was that it is in the best interest of this parish for me to remain full-time. I am deeply thankful for their trust, support, and confidence, and I do not take that affirmation lightly. I see it as a shared commitment—to pastoral presence, continuity, and leadership during a season that requires care and stability.

While this budget is not yet fully balanced, it represents a faithful and realistic step forward. It allows us to continue worshiping, serving, and caring for one another, while also naming honestly the work that remains to be done. This is not a moment for alarm, but for shared responsibility, prayerful generosity, and trust that God will provide through the gifts of this community.

If you have not yet made a pledge, or if you feel able to increase your commitment or offer a special gift to the operating fund, I invite you to do so. Every contribution—large or small—makes a real difference and helps strengthen the foundation of our common life.

Thank you for loving this parish, for walking with your Vestry, and for engaging this season with faith, generosity, and hope. Please continue to hold our leaders and our shared life at Ascension in your prayers as we move forward together.

Invitation to Serve: Vestry Registrar

The Vestry is currently seeking a new **Registrar**—also known in many parishes as the **Clerk or Secretary of the Vestry**—to support the governance and record-keeping ministry of our parish.

According to **Article III, Sections 3 and 6 of our bylaws, the Registrar is elected annually by the Vestry** at its first meeting after the Annual Parish Meeting and serves a one-year term. In the event of a vacancy, **the Vestry appoints a Registrar to complete the unexpired portion of the current term.**

Any **Voting Member of the Church of the Ascension** is eligible to serve as Registrar. A **Voting Member** is a **confirmed communicant in good standing**—someone age 16 or older who regularly worships at Ascension and is faithful in prayer and giving.



The Registrar:

- Records the minutes and resolutions of all Vestry meetings and meetings of the voting members
- Maintains the official Vestry minute book and keeps the by-laws up to date and available for inspection
- Holds the corporate seal of the church
- Performs other duties as the Vestry may assign
- Assists the **Executive Committee**, which meets monthly to prepare the Vestry agenda and distribute documents for **the monthly Vestry meeting**

How the Election Will Be Conducted

- Voting will take place by **secret ballot** at the Annual Meeting on Sunday, February 8, 2026.
- **No proxy voting** is permitted.
- A candidate must receive **a majority of the votes cast** to be elected.
- The first three candidates elected will serve **3-year terms**; the fourth elected will serve the **1-year term**.
- Newly elected Vestry members take office **immediately upon election**.

Voting Members

Voting Members are confirmed communicants in good standing, age 16 or older, who are faithful in worship and who have been faithful in giving, as defined by our Parish Bylaws.

The Rector maintains the list of Voting Members in accordance with the Canons of the Episcopal Church.

However, I am fortunate to have very many kind and loving friends and our beautiful and welcoming Church of the Ascension.

Number of years at Ascension: 20 years

Activities at Ascension: I belonged to the Roman Catholic Church, however my husband, Colin and I have attended and shared in the love and warmth of Ascension Church ever since we moved to Carroll County, 20 years ago. The examples below have been repeated most every year. They include but are not limited to the following.

- I served on committees such as the jury committee for Mistletoe-Mart.
- I worked in the Tea Room for Mistletoe-Mart for three years, then worked in the serving kitchen for two years and more recently serving and cleaning in the dining room.
- Attended and participated in most fundraisers.
- Played in the Handbell Choir for 18 years with practice every Wednesday night. You would think I would know what I'm doing by now...sadly not so much, but I keep trying.

- Participated in Thursday Night Bible Study for the last three years.
- Helped with the children's garden.
- Gave and purchased donations in the 1844 Shoppe to support this endeavor.
- Fully participated in the evening preparation classes for reception into the Episcopalian Church. I was received in April of last year. I enjoyed and benefited from these experiences.

I have to say, I learned a great deal during Thursday Night Bible Study, and my readings and discussions with Fr. Pierre-Henry.

These are 'some' of the activities that I can remember. It would be such a humbling and yet honorable service if I could contribute whatever skills and abilities I may have to the Church Vestry.

Previous church experiences (if a "newcomer"):

While I am not a newcomer, I would like to share my life-long strong personal relationship with God. Throughout my life in Canada, the UK, and the United States, it was always important to me to be a full participant and dedicated church member. As a small child, there was never a time when I missed Sunday mass and catechism class. In my home, we got on our knees in the living room and said the rosary together, every evening, when my homework was done. As a young teen, my two girlfriends and I would go to mass before school every day. At that time, we sang the mass in Latin with an old gentleman named Mr. Rudderham, who was at least as old as the dilapidated and dusty organ that he made huff and puff out the music in those early morning hours. I found great joy in being there up in the church loft. I felt closer to my God for many reasons. I share this picture only because it seemed to be in alignment with the many members of my family who chose a clerical life. My two uncles were Catholic priests, as was my older cousin, and my aunt was Mother Superior with the Sisters of St. Martha. I was surrounded by role models and reinforcers that enhanced my relationship with Christ on a daily basis. It was a difficult and agonizing decision to leave my church and find my home in the Episcopalian Church. We all have reasons for making these heavy decisions. I have never regretted this decision, and I truly love our church and all that being truly present entails.

Community activities: I have always been very involved in my community. This has been partly a result of my professional responsibilities over 50 years as an Educator and to a large part my desire to simply help others.

- Carroll County Public Schools - Assistant Superintendent for Carroll County Public Schools.
- Gerstell Academy – I served as Head/Principal of Middle School I retired from Gerstell Academy, as President of the school, when my husband was diagnosed with Alzheimer's, so I could give more time and care to him.
- Kiwanis Club of Carroll County - I served on the many community activities associated with the club. I believe the club has since disbanded.
- Bonds Meadow Rotary Club – I served on numerous committees and fundraising activities according to the club's mission.
- Partnership for a Healthier Carroll County – I served as Vice Chair and Chair of this group of all major health service providers in Carroll County. Our mission was to monitor and coordinate health services in the county, and acquire state funding for enhancement of such services, especially for low income underserved families.
- Carroll County Public Library – I served as Director of Development for the library system.

- Carroll Community College – I served on the Carroll Community College Foundation Board for fifteen years.
- Springdale Preparatory School – I served as Deputy Head of School and chaired the process to secure school accreditation which was necessary to draw international students from China.
- Carroll Garden Club – I was invited to join the Carroll Garden Club three years ago.

Our 2026 event and mission trip planning is well under way. It is shaping up to be an exciting year!


We are very blessed by the many volunteers who support the DreamBuilders MD initiatives and the ever-growing community of volunteers.




