Rector's Message:

Looking Ahead with Gratitude and Hope

Dear Friends in Christ:

As I prepare to begin my third year with you on August 15, my heart is full of gratitude. The past two years have been a time of rich connection, growth, and grace. I continue to be amazed by the generosity, dedication, and faithfulness I witness in so many of you—through your giving, your presence, and your time offered in ministry. Together we have faced challenges and successes, sadness and joy, and through it all, we've continued to walk in faith as a community rooted in love.

Summer often brings a change of rhythm—vacations, family visits, long days, and warm evenings. It's a season when some of our usual routines pause or slow down. And while rest is a gift from God, it's also a time when we can gently remind ourselves to keep the Lord at the center of our lives. Whether we're traveling, working, or simply enjoying a moment of quiet on the porch, Christ desires to meet us there. This week began with a message from our Finance Chair letting me and our Senior Warden know that, while our bank balance shows \$100,000, only \$13,000 is actually available for daily operations—the rest being restricted funds.

Maybe this is a gentle wake-up call for us all—a moment to ask how each of us can help support the mission and ministry of this parish we love. Every gift of time, talent, or treasure makes a difference. I trust in the Spirit's guidance and in the commitment of this congregation to move forward with grace and courage.

Highlights from the July 29 Vestry Meeting

Present: The Rev. Pierre-Henry Buisson, Kim Tompkins (Senior Warden), Gary Lang (Jr. Warden), Deborah Rio (Registrar), David Anderson, Beverly Baker, Mark Howe, Melissa Leahy, Liz Lowe, Roberta Wilhelm, Debbie Bargar (Finance Chair). Excused: Diana Baker.

Finance Report

Debbie Bargar, Chair of the Finance Committee, presented the June 2025 Financial Reports: Income: \$21,845.57; Expenses: \$41,068.87; Deficit: \$19,223.30

As we navigate the seasonal challenges of summer giving and an increase in restricted funds, the Vestry remains committed to fiscal responsibility and transparency. As of July 21, the bank balance was \$101,449, with \$13,419 in available funds. By July 29, that balance had decreased to \$7,790. In response, the Vestry approved a \$2,500 transfer from CD interest to the General Fund to ensure we could meet our immediate obligations—most importantly, staff payroll—with confidence and care. Though the financial picture is tight, our leadership is actively engaged in identifying creative solutions. We remain hopeful that the fall will bring renewed energy and generosity as we lean into our shared mission. The August Vestry Meeting has been rescheduled to September 2 to allow time for thoughtful review of the budget and strategic planning for the months ahead.

Stewardship

The Stewardship Planning Committee met with Canon Dina Van Klaveren on July 18 to plan the upcoming fall campaign. This year's theme, "Tell Out My Soul," celebrates our shared stories of faith and generosity. The campaign will launch on September 28 and culminate on November 2 (All Saints' Sunday). We look forward to a season of joyful giving and community celebration.

Sustaining Ministry Together

Recognizing the increasing demands on volunteers and lay leaders, the Vestry began a conversation about how to sustain our ministries with care and intention. These discussions are rooted in hope—believing that God is calling us to discover new ways of being church together. To help deepen this conversation, Canon Kristofer Lindh-Payne will preach on Sunday, August 24, followed by an Adult Forum with the congregation. This will be a time to listen, reflect, and explore together how we can share the load and continue the work God has entrusted to us.







Spotlight On: The Outreach Committee

If you ask, "What does the Outreach Committee do?", you should plan adequate time to read the response. The Outreach Committee provides consistent and reliable support to many individuals and organizations in Carroll County:

- (1) Monthly supply of household items to 5 local families
- (2) Annual "**Angel Tree**" Christmas gifts for 5 local families
- (3) Twice-a-year (May and October) collection and delivery of household items for **Shepherd's Staff Blessings Closet**
- (4) Monthly **greeting cards** to Ascension's members in long term care facilities or confined to home.
- (5) Annual "Baby Shower" to collect items for the local **Pregnancy Support Center**
- (6) Monthly cash donation to **Carroll County Youth Services Bureau**, which provides mental health services to children, adolescents and their families. The donations from Ascension are specifically for gas cards, to ensure transportation to mental health services.
- (7) Monthly cash donation to **Carroll County Food Sunday**, which provides weekly groceries to over 500 families in the county.
- (8) Monthly cash donation to the **Pregnancy Support Center of Carroll County**, which provides safe and confidential support for those facing an unplanned pregnancy.
- (9) Monthly cash donation to **Human Services Programs of Carroll County**, which provides a myriad of health, financial and educational services to fight poverty.

- (10) Monthly cash donation to **The Shepherd's Staff**, which provides short term financial,
 housing and other support services to people in
 crisis situations, with nowhere else to turn.
- (11) Monthly cash donation to **Access Carroll**, which provides Health and Dental Care services to uninsured or underinsured residents of Carroll County.
- (12)Beyond Westminster and Carroll County: The Outreach Committee organizes **Operation Christmas Child gift boxes**, and transports nearly 100 of them to the Baltimore distribution center. These boxes are sent to countries all over the world so that many, many children have a happy Christmas. (See next page!)

The primary fundraiser for Outreach is the annual **Craft and Crop Day**, held in January. This is a full-day event where crafters and friends get together for a day away from work and chores. Many people bring their own craft projects to work on and others come to enjoy the fellowship and surprises throughout the day and evening.

By supporting the Outreach Committee, you touch every corner of Westminster and Carroll County, either by specific gifts or financial support of reliable local charities.

The group meets on the second Tuesday of each month at 7:00 pm. Meetings are held in the Guild Room and/or on Zoom. The next meeting is scheduled for August 12. You don't have to commit to a full-year membership. Just come to one of the meetings, or assist with one of their many projects to experience this ministry.


